



Cheryl Swensen says, "I love sharing my love for books through creating interesting displays with my creative assistant/ co-worker Mark in the Children's wing of the library."



Eli Robertson sent in this picture of himself and his K9.






Rita Christensen submitted a picture of the KidZone in the library.



Attached is what I love most about working here and I am confident I am not the only one..."






Shelley Heaps says, "What I love most about my job is helping the people of Orem find the sweet, sweet books they crave."
