The City of Orem is switching from PEHP to Select Health for health insurance in 2024.



By switching to Select Health, employee premiums will remain exactly the same.



Just as in years past, both a traditional and a high deductible plan will be offered.



Through special negotiations by the City, the Huntsman Cancer Institute will be treated as an "in-network" provider.



Over the years, the City of Orem has switched health insurance providers when it became a financial necessity to keep benefits stable and employee premiums low.



Savings from making the switch to Select Health will be passed on to employees in the form of programs that will help keep premiums low in future years.

Unfortunately, this change requires that the City go exclusively with Intermountain Healthcare providers, meaning Mountain Star providers will be "out-of-network." We know this is a big change but we're here to help you through the process.



The City has worked out a "transitional care plan" and anyone currently receiving treatments from a Mountain Star provider will be able to continue.



Every possible attempt was made to find a way to keep the Mountain Star providers on the plan but no health insurance company could make the deal work.
